

RESOLUTION NO. 2022-155

A RESOLUTION FOR THE FINAL DETERMINATION OF THE APPLICATION OF KURTZ BROTHERS, INC. FOR A LICENSE FOR THE PROPOSED VALLEY BELT C&DD FACILITY.

WHEREAS, the Cuyahoga County Board of Health (CCBH) is the delegated authority by the Director of the Ohio EPA pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 3714.09 and is the licensing authority for Construction and Demolition Debris (C&DD) facilities under Chapter 3714 and various administrative code regulations; and

WHEREAS, Kurtz Brothers, Inc. ("KBI") is an Ohio corporation currently operating a C&DD landfill in the Village of Brooklyn Heights located in Cuyahoga County, Ohio (the "RKDF Facility") on land owned by Rosby Properties III, LLC, Inc., a partner in the RKDF Facility; and

WHEREAS, the RKDF Facility has an approved final slope for cap of 2.5 to 1 pursuant to OAC 3745-400-07(G)(2)(a)(iv); and

WHEREAS, in September 2019 KBI submitted an application for renewal of its annual license and an application for expansion of the RKDF Facility including an application for a modification of the RKDF Facility final slope, to 2.5 to 1; and

WHEREAS, KBI sought to expand the RKDF Facility, with the submitted plans showing expansion from the RKDF Facility in a continuous fashion where there would be no break in contours, just one general slope throughout the proposed combined properties; and

WHEREAS, while the application for license renewal was approved, the application for expansion was reviewed and submitted to OEPA for technical review, resulting in a recommended denial of the 2.5 to 1 exemption and recommended approval of a 3 to 1 slope on or about September 23, 2020; and

WHEREAS, CCBH approved an order granting the requested exemption to RKDF for the proposed 3 to 1 slope for the proposed expansion of the RKDF Facility; and

WHEREAS, KBI subsequently abandoned its September 2019 application for expansion and modification of the RKDF Facility but did not withdraw its request for exemption nor request transfer of the previously granted exemption; and

WHEREAS, on or about May 7, 2021 KBI as proposed operator submitted an application on behalf of CDF for licensing a new C&DD facility to be known as the Valley Belt C&DD facility ("Valley Belt") to be located north and west of the Valley Belt Road cul-de-sac and south of the existing RKDF Facility in Brooklyn Heights, Ohio; and

WHEREAS, KBI held a public meeting as required by law regarding the application for the new facility on Monday, June 28, 2021, where KBI allowed for public questions and comments and submitted the comments and answers to questions to the Board; and

WHEREAS, CCBH held a separate public hearing at a special board meeting regarding the application for Valley Belt on Wednesday, August 11, 2021, to allow for presentations from the applicant, from the Village of Brooklyn Heights, as well as, to allow for public comment; and

WHEREAS, the two meetings produced significant opposition to the Valley Belt proposal, including a petition signed by 278 individuals, written objections from over 50 residents of the Village, its Mayor and Fire Chief, and oral objections from the approximately eighty residents in attendance.

WHEREAS, the plans and specifications of the design of Valley Belt submitted by KBI included application of the prior exemption from the regulatory slope requirement of 4 to 1 granted to RKDF to a 3 to 1 slope; and

WHEREAS, said exemption from the slope requirements granted for the abandoned RKDF Facility expansion was intended to create continuous landfill from RKDF to the area that is now proposed as Valley Belt but now as a separate application will be two separate facilities separated by slopes as required by regulation; and

WHEREAS, the Board is required to follow the procedures outlined in Ohio Administrative Code ("OAC") Chapter 3745-500-120 when issuing, denying, modifying, transferring, or revoking licenses and permits to install a landfill; and

WHEREAS, OAC 3745-500-120 (C) specifies that this Board shall consider Ohio Revised Code ("R.C.") Section 3714 and R.C. 3709.21 when making such decisions; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Brooklyn Heights is comprised of 1.7 square miles and contains three other licensed C&DD facilities, namely, Amser (closed), Rosby, and RKDF plus a license for a solid waste landfill, now closed, called MERCOMP and the current application would be the fourth C&DD facility and fifth landfill in that community, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to OAC 3745-500-120(C) the Board must consider R.C. 3709.21, in its deliberations regarding a decision on approval or denial of a C&DD license application, the Board considers that imposing a fifth C&DD landfill operation in a small village the size of Brooklyn Heights would amount to a nuisance, and

WHEREAS, the CCBH board members were given the opportunity to review the RKDF application for exemption from regulatory slope requirements for the RKDF facility, the RKDF application for modification of the approved plan for the RKDF licensed C&DD facility, the application for the new Valley Belt C&DD facility, the information from the June 28, 2021 public meeting, the presentations and public comments from the August 11, 2021 meeting, as well as, additional information submitted from the public; and

WHEREAS, CCBH lacked a majority vote to approve the new landfill application and subsequently issued KBI a Notice of Intent to Deny, stating reasons for the proposed denial, as required by R.C. 119.07;

WHEREAS, KBI submitted a timely request for hearing prior to CCBH issuing a final action on the application; and

WHEREAS, CCBH appointed Hearing Officer Michael A. Dolan, Esq. to act as Hearing Officer; and

WHEREAS, Hearing Officer Dolan conducted an adjudication hearing from May 24-26, 2022, at the CCBH main office where all interested parties appeared and were represented by counsel; and

WHEREAS, KBI has the burden of proof under OAC 3745-47-15(A) to prove entitlement to the Valley Belt application; and

WHEREAS, CCBH has independently reviewed all evidence and testimony, including the Hearing Officer's Report and Recommendation; and

WHEREAS, KBI has not satisfied its burden to prove entitlement to the Valley Belt application; and

WHEREAS, CCBH has made Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, attached and incorporated by reference as Exhibit A hereto, supporting its denial.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the BOARD of the Cuyahoga County Board of Health, Ohio:

SECTION 1. That the Board disapproves the Report and Recommendations of the Hearing Officer as being contrary to law and not reasonably supported by the evidence or testimony;

SECTION 2: That the Board as a final action denies the Valley Belt C&DD facility application and informs Applicants of the same; and

SECTION 3: In addition to grounds and reasons set forth above, the Board's Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law are incorporated herein by reference and include:

- improper use by Kurtz Brothers, Inc. of an exemption granted in favor of the RKDF C&DD Facility utilizing a 3 to 1 slope in the design of the Valley Belt C&DD facility instead of the regulatory standard 4 to 1 slope where the exemption was not granted specifically to KBI as required by OAC 3745-400-07(G) for the proposed Valley Belt C&DD facility; and
- 2) Conditions that are injurious to human health and offensive to the senses, that will interfere with the comfortable enjoyment of life and property, and negatively affect the community, neighborhood and a considerable number of persons and/or the prevention, abatement, or suppression of nuisances as set forth in R.C. 3709.21.

I. <u>INTRODUCTION</u>

- 1. With the enactment of Ohio Revised Code ("R.C.") 3714 in July of 1990, the state of Ohio established a comprehensive regulatory program for the licensing, construction, and inspection of construction and demolition debris landfill facilities ("C&DD").
- 2. The Cuyahoga County Board of Health ("CCBH") is a general health district duly organized under R.C. 3709. It's five-member Board is charged with making orders and regulations as are necessary for its own government, for the public health, the prevention or restriction of disease, and the prevention, abatement, or suppression of nuisances.
- 3. In furtherance of the goals articulated in R.C. 3714 et seq., the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency ("Ohio EPA") has designated CCBH as the delegated authority for approval of C&DD landfill applications.
- 4. This matter is therefore before CCBH on the application of Kurtz Brothers, Inc. ("Kurtz Bros.") for the approval of new C&DD landfill plans. Having independently reviewed the Hearing Officer's Report and Recommendation, in addition to relevant law, exhibits, and voluminous testimony, the Board makes the following findings of fact and conclusions of law.¹

II. FINDINGS OF FACT

A. Factual and procedural history

- 5. Kurtz Bros. is an Ohio corporation currently operating a C&DD landfill in the Village of Brooklyn Heights located in Cuyahoga County, Ohio (the "RDKF Facility"). See, Joint Stipulations of Law and Fact ("Joint Stips.") at ¶¶33-34.
- 6. Although Kurtz Bros. is the landfill operator, the RKDF property is owned by non-party Rosby Properties III, LLC, Inc. ("Rosby").
- 7. This matter begins in September of 2019, when Kurtz Bros. applied to CCBH for a renewal of its annual license and an application to expand the RKDF Facility. See, Joint Stips. at ¶39.
- 8. The existing RKDF Facility has an approved final slope for cap of 2.5 to 1, which exceeds the 4 to 1 slope requirement that normally applies to C&DD landfills. See, Joint Stips. at ¶ 38.
- 9. On May 20, 2020, Kurtz Bros. submitted an exemption request to construct slopes at 2.5 to 1 at the expansion to match the existing RDKF Facility slopes. See, Joint Stips. at ¶ 43.
- 10. CCBH relies on Ohio EPA for the technical and engineering review portion of such requests. The Kurtz Bros. slope exemption was promptly sent to Ohio EPA for their technical review and comment on May 21.
- 11. After input from Ohio EPA recommending against approving the 2.5 to 1 slope, Kurtz Bros. revised their slope exemption request to 3 to 1. CCBH, as the delegated authority, granted the revised request on September 23, 2020 specific to the proposed RDKF expansion. See, Joint Stips. at ¶¶ 48-51. See also, Trans. Vol. I at 204 and Exhibits 24 and 25.
- 12. However, during this time Kurtz Bros. and Rosby fell into dispute over the operation of the proposed landfill expansion.
- 13. Apparently at an impasse with Rosby, Kurtz Bros. decided to abandon the original plans for an RDKF expansion and instead establish a new C&DD landfill, known as Valley Belt, on land that

it controls. Kurtz Bros. submitted the new Valley Belt application to CCBH on May 7, 2021. See, Joint Stips. at ¶¶ 52, 54-55.

- 14. In its application, Kurtz Bros. attached the 3 to 1 slope exemption previously granted for the RKDF Facility expansion. References to the 3 to 1 exemption are used throughout. See, Joint Stips. at ¶¶ 57, 63.
- 15. Kurtz Bros.' application to establish a new C&DD landfill rather than an expansion triggered a public hearing requirement. See, Trans Vol. I at 137-138.

B. Public hearings and testimony taken June and August of 2021

- 16. Kurtz Bros. held a public meeting regarding the proposed Valley Belt landfill in June 2021, as required by R.C. 3714.053. As part of its obligations under the statute, Kurtz Bros. provided notice of the June hearing to owners of the properties adjacent to the proposed Valley Belt facility.
- 17. CCBH held a separate, public board meeting to receive information regarding the new landfill on August 11, 2021. See, Joint Stips. at ¶72-74.
- 18. The public meeting and CCBH board meeting were the first times residents of the Village of Brooklyn Heights were provided the opportunity to raise concerns and objections to a landfill operation. See, Trans. Vol. III at 574.
- 19. CCBH finds that the two meetings on the new Valley Belt Landfill produced significant opposition to the proposal, including a petition signed by 278 individuals, written objections from over 50 residents of the Village, its Mayor and Fire Chief, and oral objections from the approximately eighty residents in attendance. See, Joint Stips. at ¶75-78. See also, Trans. Vol. I at 256-266. See also, Trans. Vol. III at 567-571.

- 20. For example, there are currently four landfills located in the Village of Brooklyn Heights and the new Valley Belt facility would be the fifth. See, Joint Stips. at ¶90. The Village of Brooklyn Heights is comprised of only 1.7 square miles and is the seventh smallest village in Cuyahoga County. See, Joint Stips. at ¶90.
- 21. Landfills currently occupy between 15% and 20% of the area land use in the Village of Brooklyn Heights. See, Trans. Vol. III at 571-573.
- 22. Non-party Village of Cuyahoga Heights adjoins the Village of Brooklyn Heights and contains multiple active landfills in close proximity to the proposed new Valley Belt Landfill. See, Trans. Vol. III at 505-506 and 587.
- 23. Cuyahoga County has lost 6.1% of its tree canopy since 2011 and the Village of Brooklyn Heights has the 25th lowest tree canopy in Cuyahoga County at 24.6%. See, Joint Stips. at ¶92. See also, Trans. Vol. I at 266.
- 24. Existing landfills in the immediate vicinity of the proposed new Valley Belt Landfill created offensive orders, and have caused noxious pests and insects to proliferate and endanger the health, comfort and wellbeing of nearby residents. See, Trans. Vol. III at 546-550.
- 25. Credible public comments from the Village of Brooklyn Heights residents, its Mayor, and Fire Chief are that Valley Belt will (i) have a lack of fire hydrant access; (ii) compound debris from unsecured loads strewn in the right of way; (iii) compound mud and waste caking the roadway, and obstruct trenches, catch basins and sewers causing blocked drains and flooding; (iv) worsen cumulative dust, noise, odor; (v) cause excessive wear and damage to local roads; (vi) increase damage to local vehicles due to debris; (vii) exacerbate heavy truck traffic congestion; (viii) cause destruction of the local tree canopy; and (ix) create unsightly and obstructed views.
- 26. CCBH finds Kurtz Bros.' responses to these public comments are not credible, or otherwise fail to address the merits of these concerns. See Exhibit 38.

C. The Valley Belt application undergoes technical review separate and discrete from the abandoned RDKF expansion

- 27. The Valley Belt landfill differs from the RDKF expansion in several ways, including a 100-foot setback requirement from adjoining properties. Trans. Vol. 1 at 42:3-23 and 137:19-22.
- 28. The 100-foot setback requirement alters the face of the Valley Belt landfill creating a "notch" that would not otherwise exist if the RKDF expansion was constructed. Trans. Vol II. at 372-373.
- 29. The 100-foot setback specified for the new landfill will create new maintenance obligations, including mowing, vegetation and groundwater management, within the "notch" that were not present when approving the 3-to-1 slope requirement for the RKDF expansion that would not have the "notch." See, Trans. Vol. II at 355-356.
- 30. At the request of CCBH, Ohio EPA gave a technical review of the new Valley Belt landfill. However, Ohio EPA staff applied the prior 3-to-1 slope exemption from the abandoned RKDF expansion to the new Valley Belt Landfill application, proceeding under the assumption that no new exemption was required. See Trans. Vol. I at 55-56. See also, Vol. I at 98-100.
- 31. To obtain an exemption from the 4 to 1 slope limitation, the Ohio EPA requires applications to "specifically have the request for an exemption." Trans. Vol. I at 98:23-25. See also, Vol. I at 239.
- 32. Kurtz Bros. did not request a slope exemption with respect to the new Valley Belt Landfill. See, Trans. Vol. I at 235-237. See also, Trans. Vol. II at 443-444.
- 33. The Ohio EPA did not recommend a slope exemption for the new Valley Belt Landfill based on their "understanding that it was already approved." Trans. Vol. I at 64. The Ohio EPA's lead reviewer "made the assumption that [the RKDF slope] exemption would also apply to the Valley Belt." Trans. Vol. I at 96. See also, Trans. Vol. I at 99.

- 34. Kurtz Bros. erroneously assumed that a staff member at Ohio EPA could approve the exemption request in lieu of CCBH. See, Trans. Vol. II at 348, 360 and 362-363.
- 35. On May 19, 2021, the Ohio EPA issued notice to CCBH stating that the application for Valley Belt complied with R.C. 3714 and Ohio Administrative Code ("OAC") Chapter 3745-400 for issuance of a license for the new landfill. See, Joint Stips. at ¶61.
- 36. At no time did CCBH give notice to the Director of the Ohio EPA of its intention to act upon an exemption proposed by Kurtz Bros. See, Hearing Officer's finding of fact on Vol. II. at 453.
- 37. Ohio EPA did not make any reference to an exemption from the slope requirement relative to Valley Belt. See e.g., Trans Vol. I at 209-210 and Exhibit 35. See also, Hearing Officer's finding of fact on Vol. II. at 453
- 38. The Director of the Ohio EPA did not provide any written comment for the CCBH to consider regarding a slope exemption with respect to Valley Belt. See e.g., Trans Vol. I at 209-210 and Exhibit 35. See also, Hearing Officer's finding of fact on Vol. II. at 453.
- 39. No order exempting the new Valley Belt Landfill from the 4 to 1 slope requirement was ever issued by the CCBH. See, Trans. Vol. 1 at 238.
- 40. With respect to the Valley Belt slope design, Kurtz Bros.' admits its application for Valley Belt is a "separate project," and states the references to the prior approval of the slope exemption for the RKDF expansion were only for information purposes. Trans. Vol. II at 362.
- 41. Kurtz. Bros. concedes the new Valley Belt landfill would have to obtain its own exemption for a slope deviating from the 4 to 1 code requirement. Trans. Vol. II at 361-363, 369-371. See also, Trans. Vol II at 347-348, 440-441 and Trans Vol. III at 466, 473, 475, 516.
 - D. CCBH issues a Notice of Intent to Deny the Valley Belt landfill license application and holds an adjudication hearing

- 42. Based on the application and information gathered during the public meetings, CCBH issued notice of its intent to deny the license application for the new Valley Belt Landfill on October 15, 2021. See, Joint Stips. at ¶81.
- 43. The reasons supporting the notice are improper use of a slope exemption granted in anticipation of the expansion of the RKDF landfill and the nuisance the additional landfill would present. See, Joint Stips. at ¶82.
- 44. Kurtz Bros. was previously issued a violation notice in 2018 for its leachate collection system at the active RKDF Facility that took years to remediate and exposed the ground and surface water, including the Cuyahoga River, to irreversible contamination. See, Trans. Vol. 1 at 267-269 and BH Exhibit 46.
- 45. The Village of Brooklyn Heights Engineer made a complaint in 2018 to the CCBH regarding dirt and debris on the roadways near the RKDF Facility. The Village has received numerous other similar complaints. See, Trans Vol. III at 591-592.
- 46. The landfill operations in the Village generate numerous calls for emergency services, including addressing fires, injured workers, dangerous road conditions and vehicle rollovers. See, Trans Vol. III at 598-599.
- 47. The Village has difficulty assessing fire emergencies that arise at the RKDF Facility and providing water to the site due to topography, varying unknown and concealed underground materials and the lack of accessible hydrants. See, Trans. Vol. III at 599-600, 602-603.
- 48. The proposed Valley Belt landfill requires trucks ranging from pickups to mining dump trucks hauling loads across local roads, dumping their content to be separated and sorted, creating dust, noise, traffic that damages and muddies roadways, causes flat tires, distributes litter and debris in the right of way and threatens lung damage. See, Trans. Vol. III at 563-565 and 602-604.

- 49. The condition of the roadways near the landfill facilities have required cleaning, repair and special action by the Village due to the landfills in the area. See, Trans. Vol. III at 586.
- 50. The proposed Valley Belt landfill presents conditions that are injurious to human health and offensive to the senses, will interfere with the comfortable enjoyment of life and property, and negatively affect the community, neighborhood and a considerable number of persons. See, e.g. Trans. at Vol. III at 610.
- 51. Kurtz Bros. timely requested an adjudication hearing based on the CCBH notice of intent to deny.
- 52. Pursuant to OAC 3745-47-03, the adjuration hearing was held on May 24-26, 2022 at the CCBH. Witnesses on behalf of Ohio EPA, Kurtz Bros., the Village, and CCBH appeared and gave testimony.
- 53. The Hearing Officer issued a Report and Recommendation on 7/29/22. The Village of Brooklyn Heights and the staff of CCBH sought an unopposed extension of time to file objections to the Hearing Officer's Report.
- 54. The Board of CCBH, acting in their quasi-judicial role, granted the request and the parties' Objections were filed on 8/23/22. Pursuant to OAC 3745-47-16, answers to Objections are not permitted.

III. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- A. CCBH is empowered with the discretion to deny the new Valley Belt Landfill license application to prevent, abate or suppress nuisances
- 55. CCBH is delegated under R.C. 3714.09 as the licensing authority for landfills within its jurisdiction. See, Joint Stips. at ¶4. CCBH is further empowered by R.C. 3714.10 to deny, suspend, or revoke C&DD licenses. It provides, in relevant part

The board of health of the health district in which a construction and demolition debris facility is located ... may deny, suspend, or revoke a license for the facility under section 3714.06 of the Revised Code for violation of any section of this chapter, a rule adopted under it, or a term or condition of the facility's license.

- 56. The phrase "a rule adopted under it" in R.C. 3714.10 encompasses the rules contained in OAC Chapter 3745-400 and 3745-500.
- 57. The conditions obligating CCBH to deny a landfill license under OAC 3745-501-15(A) are not limiting. CCBH must deny the license if one of those conditions are present, but those conditions are not the only justifications for denying a license.
- 58. When deciding whether to issue, deny or modify the license applications regarding Valley Belt, CCBH is <u>required</u> under OAC 3745-500-120(C) by way of OAC 3745-500-501-20(C)(1) to proceed in accordance with R.C. 3709.21. See, Joint Stips. at ¶24.
- 59. OAC 3745-500-120(C) states in its entirety

When issuing, denying, modifying, approving transfer of, denying transfer of, or revoking a license for a solid waste facility, infectious waste treatment facility, construction and demolition debris facility, or construction and demolition debris processing facility, the approved board of health <u>shall</u> act in accordance with Chapters 3714., 3734., and <u>sections 3709.20 and 3709.21</u> of the Revised Code, as applicable *(emphasis added)*.

- 60. On its face, R.C. 3709.21 authorizes the CCBH to make orders necessary for the prevention, abatement or suppression of nuisances. See, Joint Stips. at ¶25.
- 61. OAC 3745-500-120(C) requires CCBH to consider nuisances that may result from Valley Belt.
- 62. For purposes of Chapter 3745-400 of the OAC, which prohibits owners and operators of landfills from creating a nuisance, the term "nuisance" is defined in 3745-400-01(N) as:

anything which is injurious to human health or offensive to the senses; interferes with the comfortable enjoyment of life or property; and affects a community, neighborhood, or any considerable number of persons (although the extent of annoyance or damage inflicted upon individual persons may be unequal). See, Joint Stip. at ¶26.

- 63. The definition of "nuisance" in OAC 3745-500-02(N)(2) is applicable to "this chapter and any chapter making these definitions applicable" under OAC 3745-500-02.
- 64. As OAC Chapter 3745-500 incorporates CCBH's decision components in R.C. 3709.21, the definition of "nuisance" in 3745-500 is applicable to the "nuisance" that the CCBH may act to prevent when deciding whether to issue a license in accordance with R.C. 3709.21.
- 65. CCBH is granted the authority deny a C&DD landfill permit under R.C. 3709.21 via OAC 3745-500-501-20(C)(1) and 3745-500-120(C) to prevent, abate or suppress anything which is injurious to human health or offensive to the senses; interferes with the comfortable enjoyment of life or property; and affects a community, neighborhood, or any considerable number of persons.
- 66. Under OAC 3745-501-120(C)(5), CCBH has the authority to "ensure that an owner and operator of a [landfill] facility will comply with Chapter 3714 or Chapter 3734 of the Revised Code and the rules adopted thereunder."
- 67. The rules adopted in OAC 3745-400-11(B)(16) prohibit owners and operators of landfills from causing or allowing operations to create a nuisance or health hazard from noise, dust and odors. See, Joint Stip. at ¶32.
- 68. CCBH may deny the license application for the new Valley Belt landfill to prevent, abate or suppress nuisances or health hazards from noise, dust and odors.
- 69. On its face, the purpose of R.C. 3714.053 is to notify residents of the possibility that a new landfill will begin operating in their community, and for boards of health to receive public comment in return.
- 70. Public comments under R.C. 3714.053 and testimony under OAC 3745-47-03 reasonably establish the new Valley Belt Landfill will create conditions that are injurious to human health and offensive to the senses, will interfere with the comfortable enjoyment of life and property, and

negatively affect the community, neighborhood and a considerable number of persons. See, e.g., Trans. Vol III at 563, Trans. at Vol. III at 610.

B. CCBH is empowered with the discretion to deny the Valley Belt landfill application where the slopes do not conform to OAC requirements.

- 71. CCBH may deny a C&DD license based on a violation of R.C. 3714 or any OAC rule adopted thereunder.
- 72. On its face, R.C. 3714.10 allows CCBH to deny the Valley Belt license application for the "violation of any section of this chapter, a rule adopted under it, or a term or condition of the facility's license."
- 73. Among the rules adopted under R.C. 3714.04(A), OAC 3745-400-07(G)(2)(a)(iv) specifies that the landfill shall have a maximum slope of 25% or 4 to 1 ratio of its rise (vertical height) over its run (horizontal length). See, Joint Stip. at ¶ 30. See also, Trans. Vol. 1 at 19:4-7.
- 74. CCBH has the discretion to deny a license application for a C&DD landfill that exceeds the maximum slope of 4 to 1 established under OAC 3745-400-07(C)(2)(a)(iv).
- 75. Under OAC 3745-47-15(A), Kurtz Bros., as a license applicant, has the burden of proving entitlement to a permit, license, variance, certificate, or authorizing action. See, Joint Stip. at ¶31.
- 76. Ohio EPA conducts technical review only. Final authority to approve or disapprove of applications rests with CCBH pursuant to R.C. 3714.09. This necessitates the approval of the 3 to 1 slope exemption by CCBH, and Ohio EPA had no authority to waive this requirement.
- 77. The fact that no Notice of Deficiency was issued over the nonconforming slope proposed for Valley Belt does not entitle the applicant to an exemption for the nonconformity.
- 78. Under R.C. 3714.04(a), CCBH alone may grant an exemption from the maximum 4 to 1 slope limitation established under OAC 3745-400-07(C)(2)(a)(iv) "under such circumstances that, in the

- determination of [CCBH], are unlikely to adversely affect the public health or safety or environment, or to create a fire hazard[.]" See, Joint Stips. at ¶29, 30
- 79. The slope exemption that the Ohio EPA reviewed and CCBH granted on September 23, 2020 was limited to the "circumstances" of the RKDF expansion. See, Joint Stips. at ¶¶ 50, 51. Exhibits 24 and 25.
- 80. An expansion of one landfill constitutes different "circumstances" than establishing a new landfill for purposes of an exemption granted under R.C. 3714.04(a).
- 81. Just as the abandoned RKDF expansion could not use the prior 2.5 to 1 exemption for the existing RKDF Facility, the Valley Belt application presents different "circumstances" and requires its own exemption from the slope limitations specified in OAC 3745-400-07(C)(2)(a)(iv).
- 82. No mechanism at law exists for Kurtz Bros. to apply the previous RKDF slope exemption to the present Valley Belt license application. OAC 3745-47-15(A) suggests that, if such a law, rule, or regulation exists, the burden is on Kurtz Bros. to demonstrate its entitlement to use its previous exemption in this way.
- 83. To obtain an exemption from the 4 to 1 slope requirement under R.C. 3714.04(A), CCBH must first give written notice to the Director of the Ohio EPA of its intent to grant the exemption, receive Ohio EPA's written comments regarding the proposed exemption, and consider those comments prior to issuing an order granting the exemption under R.C. 3714.04(B).
- 84. CCBH is precluded from granting a slope exemption allowing the proposed 3 to 1 gradient for Valley Belt because the conditions precedent under R.C. 3714.04(B) have not occurred and the CCBH lacks authority to waive this requirement.
- 85. Without an exemption allowing a 3 to 1 slope at Valley Belt, CCBH may act within its discretion under OAC 3745-501-15(B)(4) to deny the license based on the application submitted for the Valley Belt Landfill since the 3 to 1 slope requirement does not conform to code.

IV. <u>CONCLUSION</u>

- 86. For all of the reasons stated above, the Cuyahoga County Board of Health disapproves the Report and Recommendations of the Hearing Officer as being contrary to law and not reasonably supported by the evidence or testimony.
- 87. Kurtz Bros. has not satisfied its burden under OAC 3745-47-15(A) "to prove entitlement to [the] permit, license, variance, certificate, or authorizing action."

HIV Prevention-\$ 1,374,511.00 STI Prevention-\$ 720,000.00

The Cuyahoga County Board of Health (CCBH) has applied for and received funding from the Ohio Department of Health (ODH) for a combined total of \$2,094,511.00 to provide HIV/STI prevention services within Region 3 (Ashtabula, Cuyahoga, Geauga, Lake, Lorain and Medina counties) for the period 1/1/2023–12/31/2023. This is the fourth program year for CCBH and 2023 is year 4 in a 4-year funding cycle.

HIV prevention services will be focused on the following priority populations: men who have sex with men (MSM); Black Non-Hispanic and Hispanic/Latino MSM, and youth aged 13 to 24 years. STI prevention services focus primarily on syphilis within the previously identified priority populations and also include women of childbearing age and congenital syphilis

HIV/STI funds will support the following:

- HIV Counseling, Testing and Referral (CTR) services. Six community based HIV testing sites;
 Competitive bidding process was done in 2020 to select current sites.
- Comprehensive disease intervention activities to ensure clients newly diagnosed with HIV or syphilis will be linked to care within 45 days of diagnosis. These services will be provided by Disease Intervention Specialists (DIS, 9 FTEs) working with the Early Intervention Services component of the Ryan White Part A program (i.e. direct connection between prevention and care services).
- Social marketing and community engagement efforts strategically implemented throughout Region 3 to reach the designated priority populations.
- Convening of quarterly Congenital Syphilis Review Board to discuss all congenital syphilis cases and develop recommendations for health system improvement and protocols.
- Management of HIV/STI reporting for Region 3

OEI 2.0 Program Summary

CCBH has received notification of funding from the Ohio Department of Health in the amount of \$697,375.00 to administer the OEI 2.0 grant program for the period 1/1/2023 through 12/31/2023. This is the 2nd year of a 3 year grant cycle. The grant program focuses on equity principles to implement policy and system changes in addition to targeting women and children at highest risk for poor health outcomes. The project encompasses three priority areas with activities being carried out by CCBH and Neighborhood Leadership Institute (NLI) as follows:

• Increase capacity to enhance equity within organization (NEW)

- o Hire Health Equity Officer (1FTE)
- o Complete 2nd Agency Assessment and implement Action Plan
- o Complete at least one agency training
- o Maintain GARE membership

• Implement policy(s) to address social determinants of health

- o Identify and implement policy to improve SDoH

• Connect 1,334 eligible pregnant women to appropriate services

- o Identify and screen women for eligibility
- Refer to appropriate resources

CCBH will provide epidemiologic support for all OEI and MCH needs, including monitoring and analysis of data as it applies to maternal and child health outcomes; analysis of data collected through navigation services; and overall program evaluation.

CCBH will lead the efforts of the SDoH Task Force in addition to overall program coordination and implementation.

NLI will provide oversight of the Neighborhood Navigation services in addition to the One Community efforts in identified communities.

This funding will support OEI staffing and activities for the following project priorities:

- 2. Adoption and implementation of policy and systems changes to improve outcomes for Black women and families
- 3. Identify and connect women to support services to mitigate risk factors for poor and health outcomes

Program Summary 2023 Cuyahoga County Creating Healthy Communities Program

The Cuyahoga County Board of Health (CCBH) applied for and has received notification of funding from the Ohio Department of Health (ODH) for the amount of \$125,000.00 (maximum funding) for the Creating Healthy Communities (CHC) Program for the period 01/01/2023 - 12/31/2023.

The Creating Healthy Communities program is funded by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and is administered by ODH. The program aims to promote health equity by focusing on communities that have higher rates of poverty and unjust health outcomes. The CHC communities include East Cleveland, Euclid and Maple Heights. CHC works to address the root causes of health disparities related to heart disease, stroke, cancer, diabetes and chronic lower respiratory disease. Strategies include at least *1 healthy eating or 1 active living in each community and must include a Food Service Guideline objective and an "upstream" city planning objective.* The following is an overview of the program's impact objectives.

The CHC Program will contract with three African American led, community based organizations for work in Euclid, East Cleveland and Maple Heights.

The CCBH will contract with the Bluestone Court Coalition (BCC) for \$15,000 to organize a youth mentor and gun violence prevention program at the Bluestone Basketball courts. BCC will engage youth and neighborhood residents to expand participation in the coalition and to seek feedback on improving infrastructure and neighborhood conditions around the basketball courts.

The CCBH will contract with Rid-All Green Partnership for \$15,000.00 to improve access to healthy and affordable foods at Farmer Jones Market. Farmer Jones Market closed in early 2020 as a result of the economic impact of the coronavirus pandemic - exacerbating food desert issues in the area. Collaboration among the Mayor of Maple Heights, Rid-All Green Partnership and other stakeholders emerged to fill this gap and reopen this critical Market.

The CCBH will contract with Northeast Ohio Alliance for Hope (NOAH) for \$13,616.26 to implement strategies to increase resident participation in City Planning and economic development approaches. NOAH will also build resident participation to inform the supermarket campaign.

- 1. CHC will continue to coordinate *and increase resident participation in multi-sector coalitions* in the targeted communities of East Cleveland, Euclid, and Maple Heights.
- 2. CHC will implement interventions to *increase access to healthy food options* within the target communities. In Euclid, CHC will work to establish Food Service Guidelines by establishing an MoU with the Bluestone Court Coalition for

community events and youth engagement. In Maple Heights, CHC will partner with Rid-All Green Partnership to strengthen Farmer Jones Market and engage residents in Environmental Initiatives.

3. CHC will implement interventions to increase physical activity opportunities within the targeted communities. In Euclid, CHC will work with BCC to organize mentoring and youth programming at the two basketball courts at Bluestone Elementary. In East Cleveland, CHC will collaborate with NOAH (Northeast Ohio Alliance for Hope) on setting responsible development standards for new city projects (upstream city planning objective) and healthy food retail initiatives.

Community Engagement:

Resident led coalition building is a focus of the CHC program and has been effective towards implementing policy, environmental and systems changes. CHC developed community participation through the implementation of two full court basketball courts in the City of Euclid and the City of Lakewood. At both locations neighborhood residents expressed interest in on-going youth programming and violence prevention approaches. In East Cleveland, CHC works with NOAH (Northeast Ohio Alliance for Hope) – a resident led organization in order to include resident voices in neighborhood development opportunities and improve access to healthy and affordable food. In Maple Heights, CHC works with Rid-All through collaboration at Farmer Jones Market – a critical, local healthy food access point for the neighborhood and surrounding areas.

Cuyahoga County Board of Health School-Based Dental Sealant Program Summary FY2023

The Cuyahoga County Board of Health has received funding through the Ohio Department of Health (ODH) for the amount of \$40,000.00 to continue administering a School-based Dental Sealant Program (S-DSP) for the period 1/1/23-12/31/23. This is a decrease of \$5,000 in funding from FY2022.

According to the Children's Dental Health Project, "tooth decay is the most common chronic disease of early childhood." A national survey found that approximately 1 in 7 children ages 6-12 had suffered a toothache in the previous six months. Children with poor oral health are nearly 3 times more likely to miss school due to dental pain." These children are often from lower income families and enrolled in the Free and Reduced Price Meals Program (FRPMP) at school. Ohio's children continue to show evidence of disparities in oral health, which is dependent on where they live, their families' income, and whether they have dental insurance. Children of color have higher rates of tooth decay. The dental sealant program is a public health initiative to provide direct dental care for targeted children in twelve school districts in Cuyahoga County. The average cost of applying a sealant to a child's permanent tooth is roughly one-third the cost of filling a cavity.

The target population for program activities will be second through sixth graders at schools in the following districts: Bedford, Berea, Euclid, Lakewood, Maple Heights, North Olmsted, Parma, Richmond Heights, Shaker Heights, South Euclid-Lyndhurst, and Warrensville Heights. In addition, we will serve students in several of the Constellation Schools, including Old Brooklyn Community, Madison Community, Parma Community, Puritas Community, Stockyard Community, Westpark Community, and Westside Community of the Arts. We have also received a support letter to offer our program in the Cleveland Heights-University Heights School District. All schools meet the ODH eligibility criteria of 40% or greater participation in the Free and Reduced Price Meal Program (FRPMP). Project staff will remain the same, including 1 FTE team of a dental hygienist and a dental assistant, along with a project supervisor. A dentist will be contracted for general supervision and consultative services as needed.

Based on ODH planning worksheets, program objectives include the following:

- 1. 56 schools will be served in 12 districts, including the Constellation Schools
- 2. 11,076 teeth will be sealed (includes 50% of those non-Medicaid eligible enrolled in target grades at 3.6 teeth/child and 50% of those non-Medicaid eligible in follow-up grades at 1.8 teeth/child).
- 3. 6,344 students will receive sealants (includes 42% of those enrolled in target grades and 38% of those in follow-up grades).
- 4. Quarterly performance reports will be submitted to ODH based upon deliverables met.

While continuous quality assurance steps are systematically being implemented, CCBH staff still receives consent forms that are incomplete for insurance information. In order to discover if a child has insurance, several portals need to be checked within the Medicaid system. Much time, effort, and persistence have resulted in collecting program revenue, resulting in approximately \$40,000 being collected in 2022.

CCBH Title X Reproductive Health and Wellness Clinic Program Narrative

CCBH has received funding as a sub-recipient of the Cleveland Department of Public Health in the amount of \$130,000.00 to operate the Reproductive Health Clinic for the period 4/1/2022 - 3/31/2023. This is level funding from the previous grant year. The program is projecting \$60,000 in program income to be used to support staffing and programmatic activities.

The Title X Reproductive Health Clinic addresses the gap in family planning services available in Cuyahoga County. The priority populations served by the CCBH Reproductive Health Clinic continue to be individuals of childbearing age, those in areas with high social vulnerability indices, adolescents and teens, and individuals with low incomes. The Reproductive Health Clinic will continue to provide education and comprehensive family planning services, including a full range of contraceptive counseling and reproductive life planning, HIV and STI testing and treatment, and referral to appropriate area social services as needed. The clinic will continue to operate twice per week on Tuesdays (10:30-6:00) in Parma and Friday (8:30-4:00) in Warrensville Heights. The clinic will continue to offer telehealth services on Thursdays and as needed. The Reproductive Health Clinic will continue to provide outreach and education to vulnerable populations throughout Cuyahoga County.
