Step 1: Pre-study	
No discussion or feedback provided by the group.	
Step 2: Action Planning	
Start	
<b>Group 1 (Viral Suppression):</b> More education on treatment options. More education to providers and more prescribers. Universal testing.	
<b>Group 2 (Linkages to Care):</b> More CHWs. Reliable services/ expansion of resources. Focusing on demographics other than MSM.	
<b>Group 3 (Support Networks for PLWH):</b> Driving with equity vs. equality. Utilizing technology. Creating informal support network portals.	
<b>Group 4 (Peer Support):</b> Peer support for individuals without HIV living with a PLWH. Collaboration with other agencies.	
<b>Group 5 (Stigma Reduction):</b> Trainings (i.e., diversity/inclusion)/ education. Normalize. Mitigate stigma of returning to care.	
<b>Group 6 (Integrated Care):</b> Implementing proper education at a fundamental level for providers. Implementing CEUs for ongoing training for those outside of EHE/HIV-specific department.	
<b>Group 7 (Housing):</b> Agency-owned housing. Incentivizing agency-owned housing. Tiny house communities free of charge.	

**Group 8 (Decriminalization):** Informing the public via national campaigns. Provide opportunities for safe disclosure/documentation. Lobbying lawmakers.

#### Continue

**Group 1:** Community forums and inclusive conversations.

**Group 2:** Same day connections. Transportation to care.

**Group 3:** Support groups. Central portals such as Positive Peer and the RW webpage.

**Group 4:** Increase awareness of Positive Peers app. Increased education on stigma.

**Group 5:** Work on change in laws and criminalization. U=U campaign.

**Group 6:** Continued CEU for those already doing HIV education. Harm reduction/rapid testing.

**Group 7:** Funding programs for housing. Collaborating with similar organizations.

**Group 8:** Advocate local representatives to lessen barriers to testing and care. Offer support/disclosure campaigns/education.

#### Stop

**Group 1:** Stigma by lack of stigma training.

**Group 3:** Competing for patients to gain funding for having the most patients and services. Being picky on who/what to support.

**Group 4:** Keeping resources to ourselves.

Group 5: Stigma.

**Group 6:** Using harmful/outdated language.

**Group 7:** Predatory behaviors. Allowing landlords to deny at-risk people.

**Group 8:** Stigma. Using laws as a weapon/control.

**Step 3: Taking Action** 

**Group 2:** Expanding CHWs to be specific to HIV. Atypical venues (i.e., rec centers, LQBTG centers). Form, design, and implement pathway hub specific for HIV/AIDS that are CHW-centered.

**Group 3:** Include everyone (patients, CHW, PCP, all organizations). Accessible networking activities that are visual and tech-driven.

**Group 4:** Quick HIV rapid tests administered at all sites. Al-anon for people who have loved ones with HIV (online and in-person), focusing on awareness, access to PrEP, education, support, etc.

**Group 5:** Mitigate stigma of returning to care. Create anti-stigma stewards who ensure that harm is not being done and to discipline/educate those workers who perpetuate stigma and harm.

**Group 6:** Required education courses for providers. A page on the CCBH website with the CEU credits for providers or others. Promotion of required trainings through a centralized health education platform. Highlight individuals who have completed trainings through social media.

**Group 7:** Identify areas of high need. Immediately connect PLWH to housing. Not isolating PLWHA, but recognizing interactions with other at-risk populations. Being cognizant of food deserts, proximity to health care, transportation, and bus routes. Securing access to funding, land, and contractors. Forming accountability groups/committees specific to housing for PLWH.

	Step 4: Observation and Evaluation	
	<b>Group 3:</b> Utilizing EPIs for measuring and reporting. Working with EPI-paired activities to track and target geographically.	
	Group 4: Monitor attendance and get feedback. QI initiatives.	
	<b>Group 6:</b> Having a community-led accountability leadership board. CCBH will give guidance and it will be up to the institutions to hold their providers accountable.	
	<b>Group 7:</b> Uplift and support committees of PLWH and encourage advocacy. Committees of people in housing. Data usage to encourage other cities and states to take action in the same way.
