New/Old Business

Open Nomination Recruitment Update

Last year, at the beginning of January, three application were submitted for the, now pending applicants: Daytona Harris, Biffy Aguriano, and Anthony Thomas. We were told several administrators who managed county confirmations, had left the county and were now working to fast-track this process for the applicants.

*Question: F. Ross – Are the people up for appointment aware?

***Response: Z. Levar** – We will update them, as once the new facilitator comes in May, we will have this done.

*Question: Again, how do the terms work?

***Response: Z. Levar** – An initial three-year term, followed by a second, three-year term, after that a one-year complete roll-off, which afterwards you can re-apply again.

*Comment: B. Glass – One note, if a chair's term is up and we can't fill the vacancy, they may be asked to stay.

*Response: Z. Levar – The plan is to re-vamp this process and the new facilitator will help coordinate this.

Conduct Bi-Annual Analysis of PC Membership for Federal Reflectiveness Mandate – B. Gayheart

We are currently at 30 members, this includes five pending official confirmation. In reflectiveness, we have gaps in youth (ages 20-29), and the Hispanic population. All other categories are good and in compliance.

*Comment: N. O'Neal – Maybe find way to recruit from youth groups, as we get them, but can't keep them.

*Comment: Z. Levar – Yes, we've had them as guests, maybe more targeted outreach needed on that. *Comment: B. Glass – Maybe now with virtual meetings, it's a good time to engage them.

*Comment: N. O'Neal - Also feel they're recipients of our work and should give back, but how is the question.

***Comment:** F. Ross – Maybe a meet and greet with PC and youth, as a way to develop relaxed relationships.

*Comment: Z. Levar – Also consider PC bandwidth and using best time commitment for PC.

***Comment:** J. McMinn-Gatekeeper idea, we can meet w/Jen, get ideas, then do meet & greet to get group buy-ins.

*Question: Z. Levar – Anything on Positive Peers?

*Response: J. McMinn – No, but we have a person that does this.

*Comment: B. Gayheart – Maybe a workgroup to do a deep dive.

*Comment: N. O'Neal – Maybe we can add education to CLC agenda.

*Comment: K. Dennis – Many don't know about RW, even in schools, so info must get out first.

***Comment:** B. Glass- Educating is a big part, because if we don't meet PC reflectiveness, we'll lose everything, as we need more official, voting members to govern the process.

***Comment:** J. McMinn – Also, we've talked on ways to promote RW with technology, maybe when recipient has time, we can re-visit this.
