Highlights from OD2A Evaluation findings on naloxone distribution Year One (September, 2019 - August, 2020)

The evaluation for OD2A examines naloxone distribution and training programs, naloxone is a medication administered to rapidly reverse an opioid overdose. It is also known by the brand name, Narcán®.

Each naloxone kit contains two doses (4 mg ea.)

## High Burden Overdose Areas



# **Overdose Response Training**

Overdose response training includes free education on opioid overdose risks and how to recognize a potential overdose and administer naloxone.

MetroHealth provides training to law enforcement, service entities (such as homeless shelters and clinics), and lay responders. Lay responders receive one-on-one training.
