FLU & COVID-19 UPDATE

Brian Kimball, Interim Director, City of Cleveland

There has been little admittance in emergency rooms with flu-like symptoms and no deaths reported. For the current Covid report, we continue to see low activity in our community levels. The County reports about 45 new cases per 100,000, which is on par with the state average. On May 11th, the Covid emergency ended, but this will not impact vaccination and other treatments, as they will still be available free of charge. Also, vaccines for those uninsured will remain free through 2024 and available at public health centers and pharmacies.

Administrative Report – M. Baker

Our full award was provided in early April, we are now finalizing contracts for board approval at the end of April and, all of our providers will be able to move forward at that time. We are also in the process of preparing our year-end report to HRSA on our achievements and accomplishments from 2022. Last, we are happy to announce that we will be hosting CWRU medical students in August, and we will be looking to have two-three people speak on their experiences with the health care system. Later in the meeting, we will ask for names PLWH interested in joining the panel. Additionally, this discussion will be held at CCBH (Cuyahoga County Board of Health), around the beginning of August. More details will follow.

Fiscal Report - M. Baker

FY22 Final Closeout Expenditures - Core: 79.24%, Support: 20.76%, Expenses: 95.13%, for 12 months Target: 100%, Full Award provided \$4,917,218. Overall, a very good year in allocation and spending.





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Medicaid Update - A. Thomas

First, Medicaid eligibility has moved from the MAGI (Modified Adjusted Gross Income) system to IMPACT (Illinois Medicaid Program Advanced Cloud Technology), a new provider enrollment system. For clients affected by its reverse direction from reduced coverage on Medicaid, premiums will still be covered during this time and then later reviewed again for eligibility. Second, there will be upcoming trainings on navigating the system. The first training will provide guidance on how to complete a renewal package, as it is important they are done correctly in order to help determine eligibility appropriately. I Second LTC form set for morning of June 14th trainings. Also reminder as renewals come in make sure if verifications and changes are done timely so they won't be subject to auto discontinuances. Planning Council Operations-

PSRA Presentation – C. Droster, J. Patterson

This presentation is to prepare and give everyone an overview of the PSRA (Priority Services & Resources Allocation) process for next month's PSRA meeting on June 21, 2023

Overview of Priority Services (PS) Process

- 1. As part of the PSRA process, all Part A Core (8) and Support (6) service categories must be ranked.
- 2. Before the June PSRA meeting, the Strategy & Finance Committee leads the ranking process during Strategy & Finance Committee meetings.
- 3. The final ranking is voted on by the full Planning Council at the June PSRA meeting.
- **C. Droster** S&F completed the ranking process for Part A services funded in the TGA, as of May 3, 2023.

Overview of Resource Allocation (RA) Process

- 1. The resource allocation process of the planning council takes place during a meeting of all PC members in June each year. The process is led by the Strategy and Finance Committee.
- 2. HRSA does not increase Ryan White Part A budgets based on advocacy. Requests for additional funds, even if backed by data, are generally futile.
- **J. Patterson** Every November, we do reallocation, where we work closely with the recipient to move money across services categories in order to ensure we expend funds fully as possible throughout the grant year. As this was an overview of PSRA, we will present this again in June, and will also provide the actual categories that were flagged for discussion. If anyone is interested in the PSRA process, feel free to join the S&F meeting or workgroup.

Monthly Progress Report from HRSA Project Officer – K. Dennis

Had first meeting as facilitator, she raved on TGA being amazing and all of what she likes. We have great longevity and folks who really know their stuff. Question asked most was making sure we are good on recruitment and right mix of both, reflectiveness, as well as being on target with PSRA in ranking categories.

Committee Reports:



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Community Liaison Committee (CLC) - F. Ross

We discussed the survey which closed on the 16th, the Lorain (June 24th) and Ashtabula (June 3rd) Pride events. If interested in helping, please let L.J. know so she can give further updates. Also, please don't commit unless 100% sure you can. Last, the CLC workgroup is in process of setting our next meeting date for moving forward on listening sessions and how to proceed with housing issues.

Strategy & Finance (S&F) – C. Droster

The S&F Workgroup met on April 26th and went over resource allocation and revised the PSRA feedback survey, which will all be brought up next month in PSRA. Also, as reported in the fiscal report, we have spent 95% of our budget, which is good, leaving 5% underspent, which HRSA usually will allow us to carryover.

Membership, Retention & Marketing (MRM) – B. Gayheart

We met this month, went over reflectiveness and come to realization that our focus has to be on young males and Latinos. As remaining good in reflectiveness is a priority with HRSA, we will add this to our future MRM agendas. Also, COR forms were sent out in April packets to be completed. If you need another one, please let L.J. or Toni know. We also assigned mentors to our five (5) new applicants, for our mentor program.

Quality Improvement (QI) - J. McMinn

We met earlier today. We are now shifting from our deep dive into mental health and psychosocial support categories, as we have completed directives for them, which will be approved at PSRA. For our next steps, we will not be reviewing a service category, but rather looking at a category of the population, namely, aging PLWH 50 and over. Because this number continues to grow, we want to take time to look at services available, people who are working with this population, and then come up with best practices. We started today, discussing articles and research done, and we will pick up again in August on this topic: Positively Aging.

HIV Prevention Committee (Prevention) - D. Houston

We last met March 1st, and announced Rachel McDade joined Central Outreach and is now Clinic Manager. We also have open positions for DIS workers. At the meeting, we received an Epi update, had a presentation from CRWU students on a new project for HIV testing, and a presentation by Alex Nelson on the preventative injection treatment, Apretude. We also reviewed our committee work plan, and our next meeting will be: Wednesday, June 7, 2023 from 4-5:30 pm.
