


The Centers Overdose Data to Action: LOCAL


1A-Linkage to and Retention in Care

2A- Harm Reduction in Health care/Community


The Centers syringe service programs (SSPs) seeks to enhance their harm reduction activities within their SSPs located at their mobile units and clinics including needs-based needle exchange, HIV and HCV testing, naloxone distribution, harm reduction kits, safe sex kits, and fentanyl strips.
