



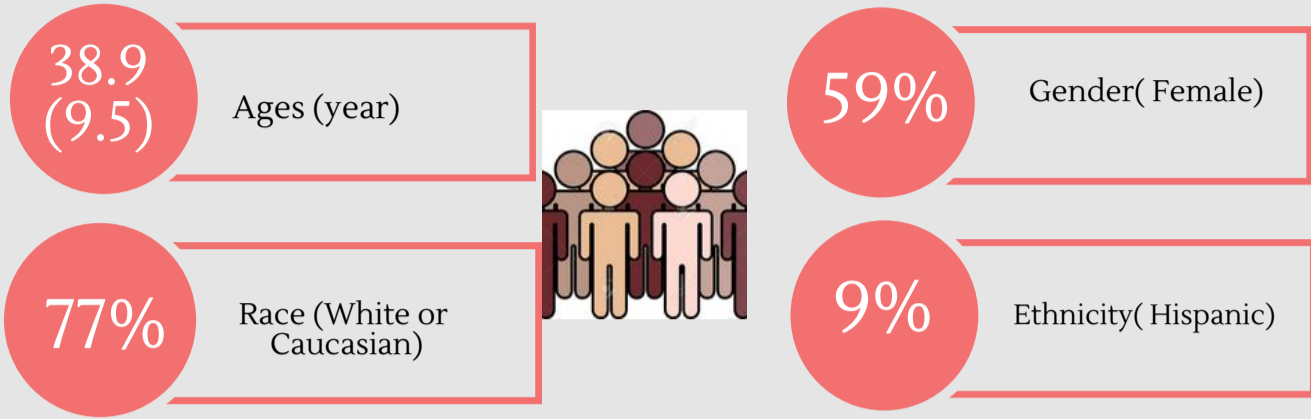

The Centers is a partner agency in Strategies 1A, 2A, 3A and 4A. Their primary activities focus on providing training and technical assistance to enhance provider education and patient management, harm reduction, prevention, treatment, data collection, and public policy.

2A- Harm Reduction in Health care/Community

The Centers syringe service programs (SSPs) seeks to enhance their harm reduction activities within their SSPs located at their mobile units and clinics including needs-based needle exchange, HIV and HCV testing, naloxone distribution, harm reduction kits, safe sex kits, and fentanyl strips.

Each naloxone kit contains two doses (4 mg /dose)

3A- Stigma Reduction in Health care/Community

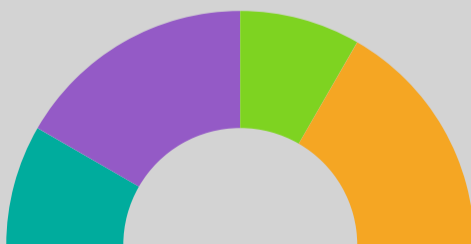
Centers Clients were to asked to complete a brief survey to gather insight regarding their views about the benefits of harm reduction services and tools.
