

Hispanic UMADAOP (HUMADAOP)



HUMADAOP supports the Hispanic community by connecting, reengaging and providing ongoing support for individuals with SUDs to access treatment. All services, including harm and stigma reduction resources, peer support, and education/training are delivered in a culturally and linguistically competent manner.

> **KEY DEMOGRAPHICS OF ENGAGED** CLIENTS (N=67)

Treatment Services	Referred	Linked
Multiple treatments	24%	15%
Inpatient	4%	6%
Outpatient	65%	79%

- Average Age: 40
 - Race: 27% White, 13% Black, 22% **Multiracial**
- Ethnicity: 73% Hispanic
- Gender:75%Male, 24% Female

Barriers to referrals and linkages:

- Lack of time
- Work schedule conflicts
- Transportation

54% reported criminal history






25% reported mental health condition
