- Gender: 75% Male, 24% Female

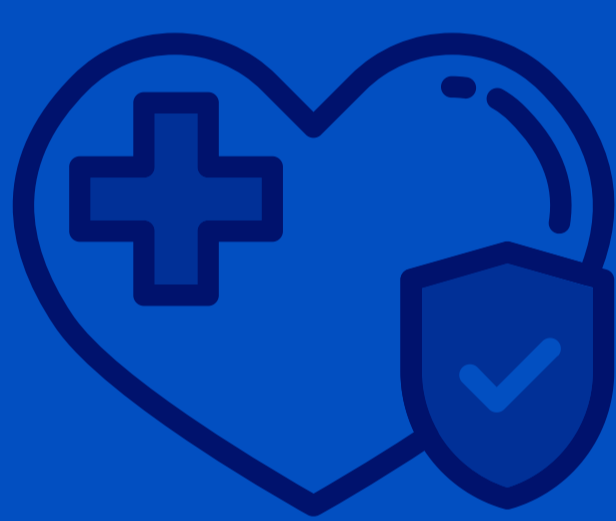
Treatment Services	Referred	Linked
