OBJECTIVES AND GOALS

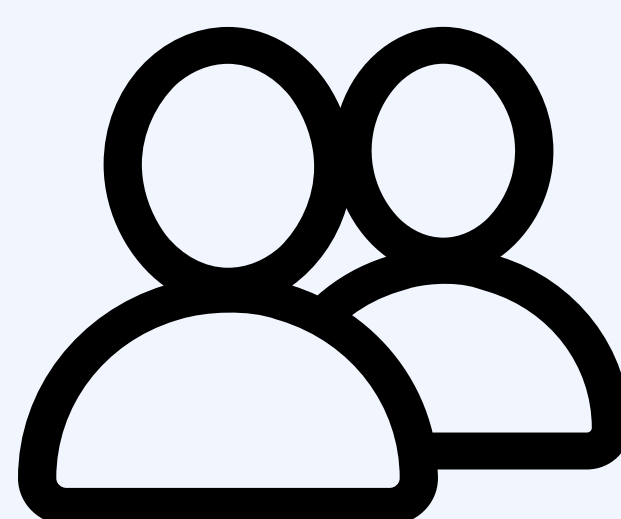
Sister's of Charity Foundation of Cleveland works to improve the lives of those most in need with special attention to families, women, and children living in poverty. The foundation's aim is to increase the number of clients engaged, and in need of referral for services that address Substance Use Disorder (SUD). Additionally, its mission is to engage with clients and increase the number of linkage to care.

In Year One, **35** clients were screened for Substance Use Disorder, specifically for those that self-reported use of stimulants and opioids. **Six** of those clients agreed to be referred to a program and 100% linked to services.

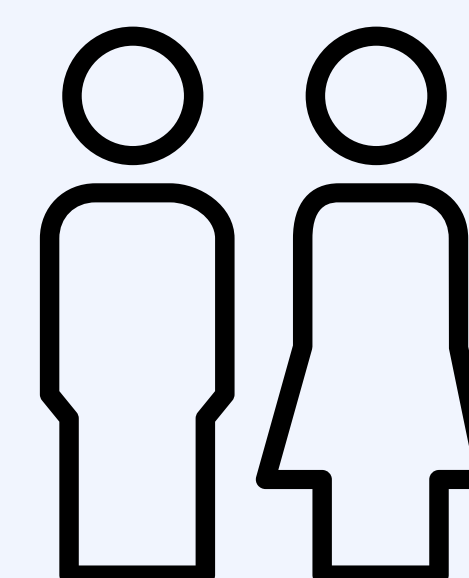

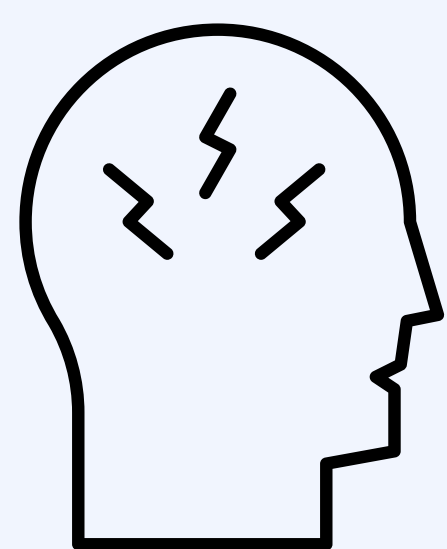

80% reported having a mental health issue



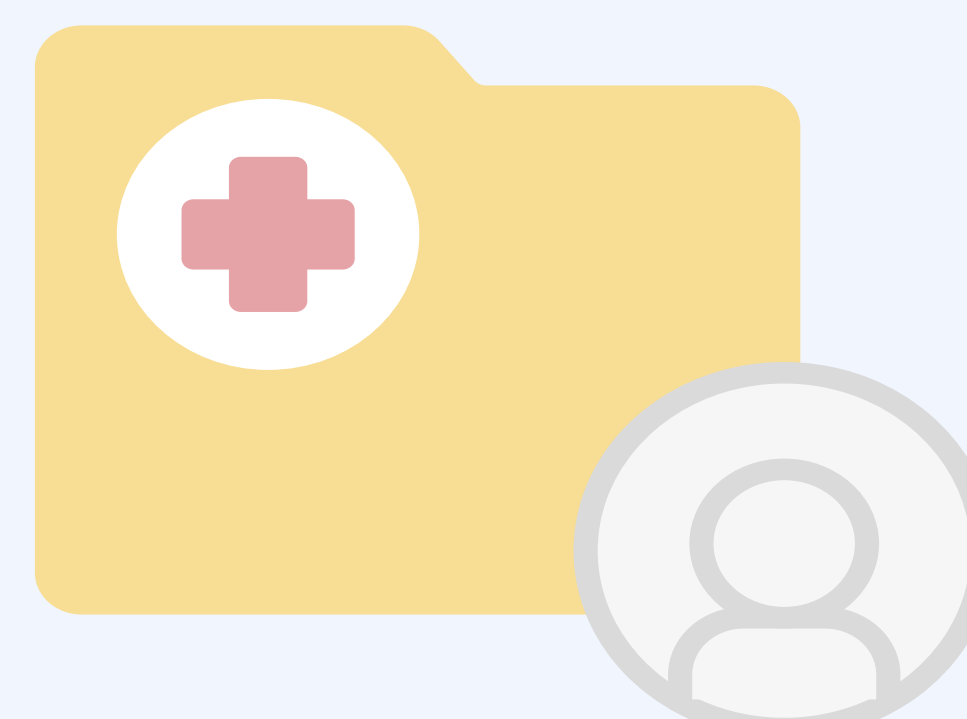
20% self-disclosed they were houseless

Clients Engaged

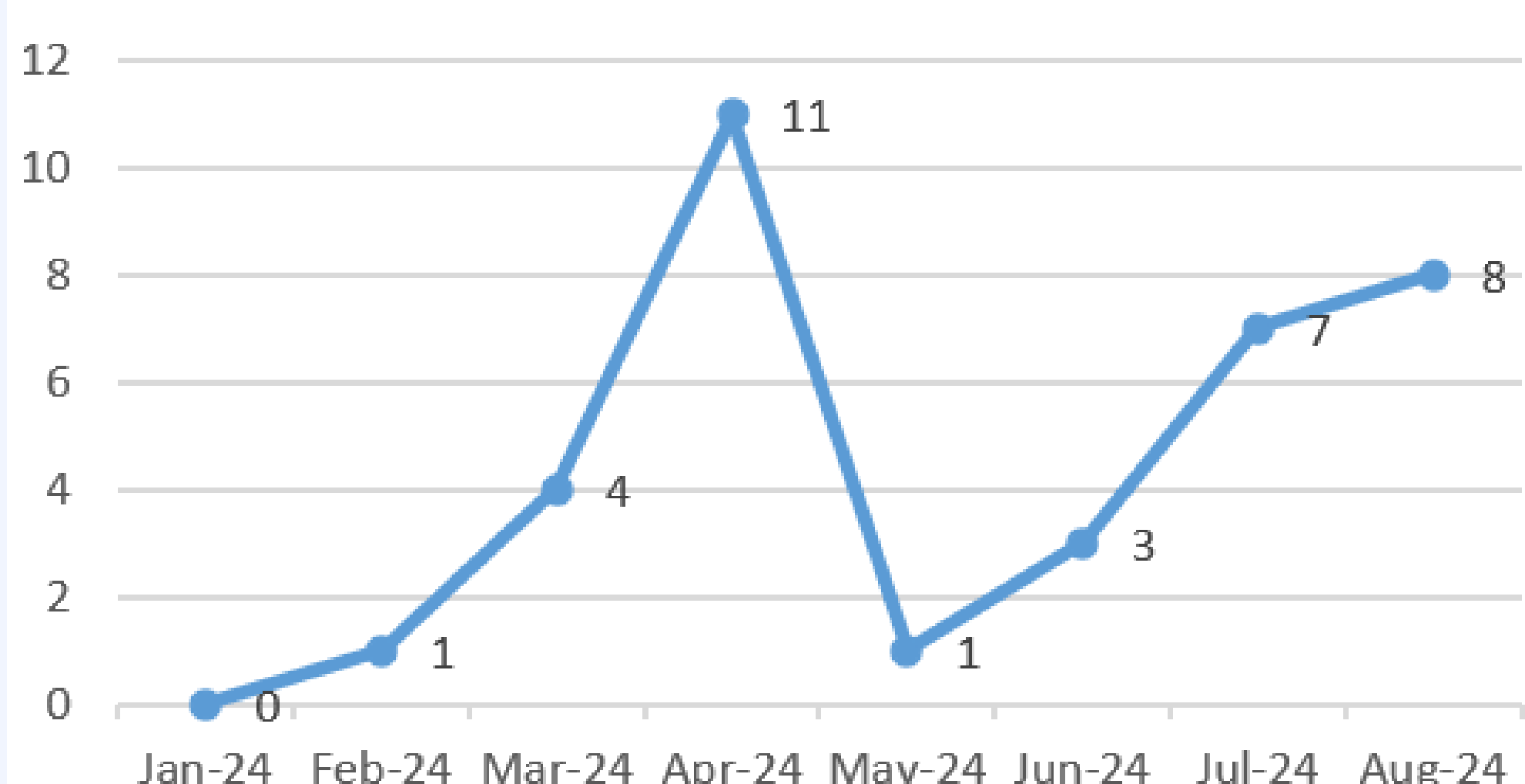
35 clients were referred to treatment services and 17% (six) of these clients agreed to the referral.
