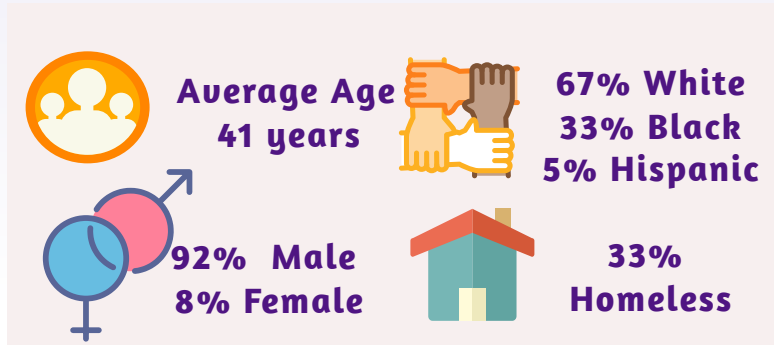

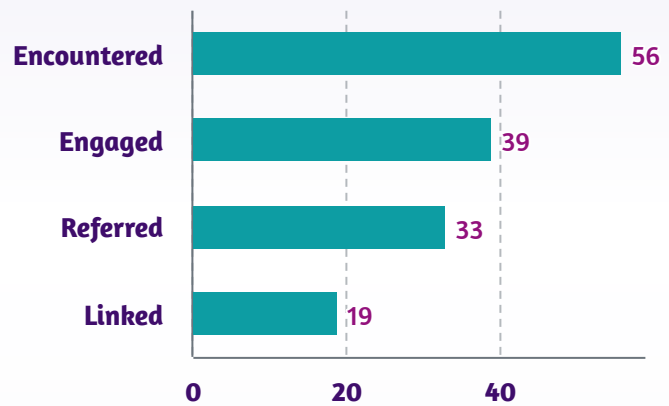
Highlights from OD2A Evaluation for Thrive's Emergency Department-based peer support at MetroHealth Overnight ED, community peer support at MetroHealth Parma & Broadway, and Workforce Development Program- January-August 2024

ED-based Peer Support MetroHealth Overnight ED

Thrive peer supporters meet with the individuals presenting at the MetroHealth Overnight Emergency Department with a behavioral health diagnosis (particularly opioid use disorder) and connect them with treatment and other medical and/or social services in the community. Additionally, they have a community peer support program for clients in outpatient settings at MetroHealth Parma and Broadway locations.



Treatment Referrals & Linkages



Detoxification and Inpatient treatment were most commonly referred treatment services.

- 31 clients encountered.
- 6 were given additional treatment referrals.
- 12 were referred to other services like community peer support and Medicaid.

Community Peer Support MetroHealth Parma & Broadway

Workforce Development Program

Thrive workforce development program trains and supports individuals with lived experience to become certified peer recovery supporters.

- 10 interns enrolled; all completed Ohio PRS Certification.
- 9 completed internship and 6 got job placements.
