Woodrow's Project SOAR peer recovery supporters provide 24/7 virtual-on-call support to individuals who present with an opioid use disorder in the Cleveland Clinic-Lakewood and Lutheran Hospital emergency departments.

59% White 42% Black 6% Hispanic

75% Male,25% Female



Clients changing their mind at the time of ED encounter was most tommon reason of not linking with treatment services.

33% experienced homelessness Insurance

33% reported history of trauma Mental Health



53% reported mental health condition



38% clients reported at least one previous overdose.

Project SOAR 30-Day and 6-Month Follow-Up





Follow-Up Response 30-Day - 91 Clients 6-Month - 15 Clients

64 (70%) clients at 30-day and 12 (80%) clients at 6-Month follow up were engaged in treatment.





Patient Navigator Sept2023-Aug2024

Woodrow patient navigator assists residential clients with services to promote recovery and independence.



Total Clients = 24, all women 39 Years - Average age 71% White 25% Black 4% Hispanic 63% Homeless

Most commonly identified needs -Long term housing (83%) Volunteer opportunities (79%) **Short term housing (75%)** Employment (62%)

The patient navigator successfully assisted clients with 65% of the services needed
