- Services include: adult day services, adult development, congregate meals, and transportation, home delivered meals, holiday meals, digital literacy
- Monthly meetings of over 71 senior centers and senior serving agencies throughout the county
- Options for Independent Living
 - Serves older adults and those with disabilities 18 and over who are low-income but not eligible for any Medicaid Waiver programs
 - Includes home-delivered meals, personal care, homemaking services, laundry services, chore services, emergency response systems, minor bathroom modifications
- Home and Community Based Health Services
 - o Appropriate mental health, developmental, and rehabilitation services.
 - Home health aide services and personal care services in the home include personal care services and homemaking services.
- Home Support
 - Comprised of nurses, schedulers, and home health aides
 - Goal is to provide services to achieve and maintain a clean, safe, and healthy home environment
 - Intake process RN completes initial plan of care; RN provides on-going case manager services; RN visits clients every 60 days; RN works with family members, physicians, social workers, dieticians, etc to ensure client's needs are met.

Priority Setting and Resource Allocation

- Priority setting prioritize services that are most needed and where our funding should go, based on surveys that we do, previous years, etc. It's our way to say "this is what's most important."
 - All service categories must be ranked
 - The Strategy & Finance committee leads this process during meetings in April and May
 - Final ranking is voted on by the Full PC in June
 - o You can participate in the conversation even if you are not a PC member.
- Resource Allocation the process where Planning Council determines where the money should go.
 - Determine what percentage of funds go into each service category
 - o Mark your calendars: June 18th from 12:00 4:00 PM
 - Resource allocation workgroup will recommend service categories for special consideration
- PSRA Process
 - Data Presentations > Priority Ranking > Directives > Resource Allocation
