c. Determine Content for the HIV Newsletter

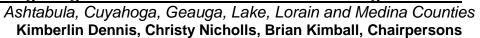
The newsletter comes out in June. What information do you want to include?

- We generally include the schedule, a reminder that everyone is welcome to come to the meetings, link to the application.
- CLC join us for our educational sessions.
- The 2nd Planning Council video is going through final edits and should be ready in the next couple of weeks. One video is completed and we could potentially add that to the newsletter.
- Maybe focus on Full PC or CLC instead of the full schedule.
- Last December, we did a Member Spotlight.
- We will do a Member Spotlight, Seeking New Members, and a link to the video for the June newsletter.

d. Discussion about PSRA Funding Scenarios

- We may need to have plans for differing funding scenarios in case funding is reduced. Ex: What does it look like if our grant funding is reduced by 30 40%?
- We don't know what is going to happen. It's important that Planning Council understands that if we don't do anything different, the money will get cut between all 14 categories as it has been allocated.
- Part A has its own Federal Poverty Level guidelines for eligibility independent of the State FPL guidelines.
- PSRA in June will set the allocations for FY26.
- PSRA uses an Allocation Scenario worksheet plan and can show alternative scenarios, such as a 10% cut.
- Reallocations are set in November, but it is possible to do reallocations at other times.
- We could set criteria to call a special meeting, for example if the final award is cut by more than 25%, or there is a change in the FPL eligibility for Part B, etc.
- If we're looking at substantial cuts to the program, you would likely cut services. For example, If the trigger is a 25% cut, you tell us what categories will lose funding. The lowest priority service categories would likely be cut so that we can maintain services in the higher priority categories.
- Whether/ How to include this conversation in the PSRA process on June 18th?
- We could come up with a worst-case scenario plan, and hope that we never have to use it.
- Talking about this at PSRA might make people panic.
- If we don't address this during PSRA and then the funding is cut, then it's just a reduction across all categories. If we proactively have a plan when funding is cut, we could choose categories to sunset.
- This is a big decision to ask people to make on the spot at PSRA.





	 The reason it was suggested to be part of the PSRA process is because we've spent the last couple months looking at the data in preparation for PSRA. The decisions should be based on the data. We could prepare people for the discussion at Full PC, to be ready for this discussion at PSRA. Get people to understand what do these priority numbers really mean when it comes to funding cuts. We need to plan for two potential scenarios: How do we handle an emergency cut that might happen to FY25 funding? How do we handle planning for a potential cut to FY26 funding? Resource allocation workgroup could present a funding cut scenario for PSRA. At PSRA – decide what the threshold would be in order to call a special meeting.
