Prevention Community Highlight

LGBTQ+ Community Needs Assessment – Tyler Stimpert, BSBA, MPH presenting

- Overarching goals include: Increase awareness about public health as it relates to LGBTQ+ community in Greater Cleveland; describe the local LGBTQ+ population demographically; describe the current status and resources available to the local community by domain; develop recommendations to *check recording*
- Project timeline was from January 2023 to December 2024
- Over 2,000 unique survey responses
- 26 listening sessions were held in total with 178 participants

 - Interactive self-reported health and socio-demographic dashboard

- Priorities and Lived Experiences
 - Community identified priorities: Foster a culture of inclusiveness within and outside the LGBTQ+ community; enact and enforce laws against discrimination; Address uncertainty and feelings of helplessness by promoting actionable solutions and community engagement; Increase accessible community education.
- Represented, recognized, included, advocated for, and accepted
 - 46% of respondents identified self-esteem as a source of difficulty in life
 - 55% of respondents feel worried about being safe or accepted because of their LGBTQ+ identity
- HIV Knowledge and Prevention
 - 5% of respondents don't know HIV status
 - 5% of respondents rate their knowledge of HIV and HIV prevention as Poor
 - 9% are not currently taking PrEP but they do want PrEP
 - 16% of those on PrEP got their last medication given to them by someone else with a prescription
- HIV testing behaviors

	 43% get tested only when they feel they need to be tested 27% have never been tested for HIV 4% of respondents indicated a positive HIV status 65% identify as Gay; 68% identify as Male 86% are taking medication prescribed by a doctor to manage their HIV; 2% have never taken any medication to manage HIV 18% are currently receiving gender-affirming hormone treatment 21% currently experiencing housing insecurity
