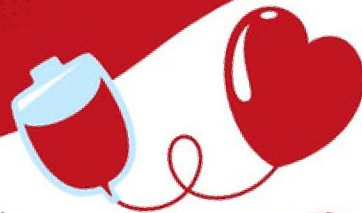

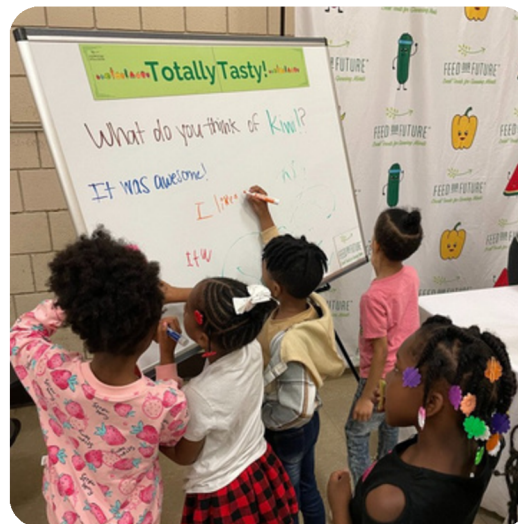
TOTALLY TASTY



Totally Tasty events are a new and exciting way for students to discover their own passion for fresh food and to share it with their peers. Their feedback helps school nutrition teams understand what students actually want to eat, and in turn, build menus that excite students and parents.

Our staff works with child nutrition professionals in K-12 school districts to customize an event that creates opportunities for students to try new local and regional foods. Foodservice directors acquire the products and we engage students in the voting station, capturing their comments and providing the district with the results.

Together we have one goal: to make tasting new foods as easy and fun as possible.

DONATIONS

One of our most successful and longest-lasting promotions has been the seed program. Designed in collaboration with our generous donor, Marc's/MGI, together we have distributed an estimated 10 million one-ounce packets throughout the United States and around the world. Over the past 14 years, the seeds have supplied food pantries, homeless shelters, senior centers, faith-based organizations and underserved communities with fresh, nutritious produce.



NUTRITION EQUITY

We took a trip to the Arrow Nutrition Equity Zone to visit their urban farm and welcome them as a partner in our seed donation program.

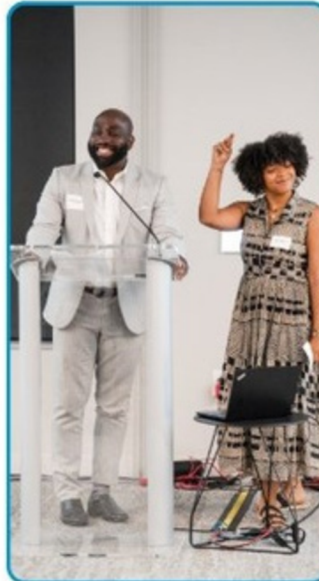
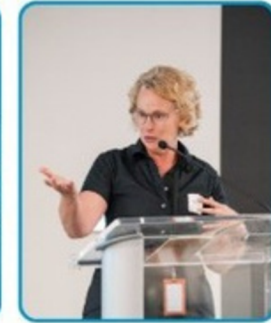
In partnership with the Case Western Reserve University Swetland Center for Environmental Health, this work brings together homesteaders and urban farmers to engage children and families by integrating agriculture, horticulture and art into educational classes and workshops.





Our federally funded REACH program uses proven strategies to help improve health, prevent chronic diseases, and reduce health and racial disparities.

The REACH Fellowship is a six-month leadership program that promotes food systems change. Priorities include sustainability, equity and health and increasing access to networks and resources.

HEALTHY URBAN TREE CANOPY PROGRAM LOCAL MUNICIPALITIES

A tree canopy is the layer of leaves, branches, and stems that cover and protect the ground, as viewed from above. Overall, it acts as green infrastructure and provides benefits such as reducing heat islands, improving air quality, managing stormwater and boosting community well-being.

ENDING THE HIV EPIDEMIC

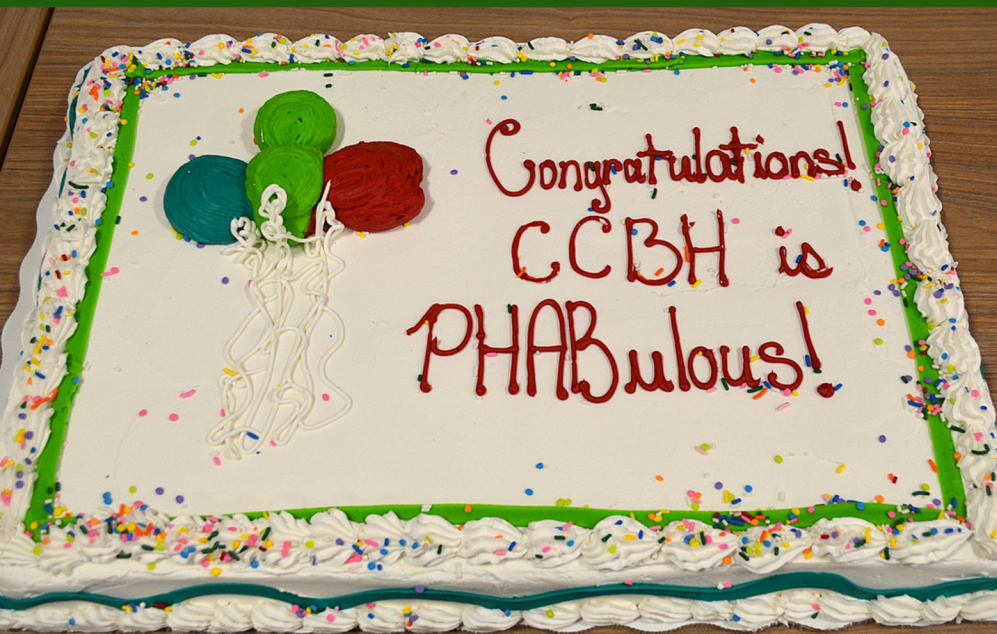

REACCREDITATION



As the accrediting body for local and state health departments, the Public Health Accreditation Board (PHAB) advances standards of excellence and accountability for the systems that promote and protect the health of all people. The accreditation process is rooted in national standards, including the 10 Essential Public Health Services.

Local health departments earning reaccreditation demonstrate a sustained focus on performance improvement and community-centered practice. Every five years, these departments undergo another review to maintain their accreditation status and ensure continued alignment with national expectations and evolving public health priorities. Across the country, more than 450 health departments have demonstrated their performance and accountability to their communities, policymakers, and other stakeholders through PHAB accreditation.

In the fall, after several months of preparation and review, our agency was awarded reaccreditation status by PHAB. We are grateful to our partners, stakeholders, community members and, above all, our CCBH team for their participation and dedication to maintaining quality service delivery and improving health outcomes.
